

Newton International Fellowships 2026 - Summary Eligibility Checklist

The below document is for your reference only. You **do not** need to submit this document to the Royal Society for your application to be considered.

This list is not exhaustive but contains frequent areas of enquiry. You may be able to find the answer to your questions in the Scheme Notes (available on the scheme webpage) for the round. SECTION A: Eligibility criteria

If you answer 'yes' to all questions in Section A, you are eligible to apply.

Questions 1-6 detail mandatory eligibility criteria. Questions 7 and 8 give guidance on eligibility criteria for exceptional circumstances.

1	Have you completed, or do you expect to complete, your PhD before the closing date for applications (11 March 2026)?	
2	Has it been less than five years since you obtained your PhD? For guidance and exceptions, including for career breaks, please refer to Section 4: Eligibility in the Scheme Notes (available on the scheme webpage).	
3	Is your proposed research subject area covered by the remit of the Royal Society? Please see our website here for further information. Applicants for social sciences and humanities should apply to the British Academy .	
4	Do you have citizenship of a country outside the UK? Please note: you may still answer yes if you hold dual citizenship with the UK, if you have lived outside the UK for all or the majority of your life.	
5	Are you currently living, working or studying outside the UK? Please note: if you are working outside the UK but employed by a UK organisation you are not eligible to apply.	
6	Do you intend to apply to an eligible UK Host Organisation and with a Sponsor who is based at the same UK Host Organisation?	

	<p>Please note: you can only be based at one UK host Organisation with one UK Sponsor, who must be based at the same Organisation as you. Please see here for guidance on Host Organisations.</p>	
7	<p>If you have visited the UK in the 12 months prior to application, have these visits been less than three months in total? If no, then you are ineligible to apply.</p> <p>Please note: The exception to this is if you are a refugee in the UK according to the Geneva Convention or have humanitarian protection status.</p>	
8	<p>Did you complete your PhD at a university outside the UK? If no, please answer 8a and 8b below.</p> <p>Please note: If the answers to both 8a and 8b are “yes”, then you are eligible to apply.</p>	
8a	<p><i>Please complete this question only if you answered “no” to question 8.</i></p> <p>a) Have you been based outside the UK for more than 12 months prior to submitting your application?</p>	
8b	<p><i>Please complete this question only if you answered “no” to question 8.</i></p> <p>b) Will your Fellowship be based at a different eligible UK Host Organisation to where you completed your PhD?</p>

4	<p>Are your proposed Fellowship start dates between 01 October 2026 and 31 March 2027?</p> <p>Please check the proposed start and end dates of your Fellowship: for example, if your Fellowship starts on 01 October 2026, it will end on 30 September 2028. If your Fellowship starts on 31 March 2027, it will end on 30 March 2029.</p>

8	<p>Are you the only Newton International Fellowship candidate your UK Sponsor is supporting in this round of applications?</p> <p>Please note: Sponsors are limited to supporting one application per round. This does not mean one application per institution, it means that each UK academic Sponsor can only support one application in any round.</p>

9	<p>If you are planning to conduct fieldwork outside of the UK as part of your research, will this be less than one month per annum?</p> <p>If no, please answer 8a.</p> <p>Please note: fieldwork is optional.
